- We have established a culture and a framework which encourages professional relationships to prosper and building on that success. We will work to expand the profile of our membership, encouraging members to engage with the expertise, experience, and wider networks of colleagues from diverse backgrounds. We will:
 - <u>Increase the value of membership</u> by embracing interstate connectivity and promoting opportunities to connect on specific issues and objectives thereby enhancing the depth of knowledge available to the NCSS community and our outlying networks.
 - <u>Enrich members' sense of belonging</u> and maintain our commitment to proactively promote a culture of equity, diversity, and inclusion.
 - <u>Develop and support our volunteer network</u>, providing opportunities for members to contribute to the ongoing success of our organization, our members, and our mission by directly supporting the development of peers and the social studies profession.
 - <u>Engage with other networks, groups and organizations</u> who share our vision and values, providing members with access to new resources, opportunities and perspectives on social studies *and* other disciplines, including STEM subjects and the arts.
 - <u>Adopt a digital-first approach to service delivery</u>, continuing to invest in our online services and maintaining our use of technology for virtual engagement with and amongst our membership.

 - Translate research into results by collaborating with other organizations to <u>stimulate</u> <u>innovation in pedagogical approaches</u> to learning.

 - Extend our network of stakeholders and <u>build relationships with new partners</u> who can help us to identify pedagogic innovation at an early stage and assess its impact on our members.
 - Help <u>connect the right people at the right time</u>, enabling conversations that nurture transformation and ensure that the core components of social studies discourse (observation, analysis, interpretation, reflection, evaluation, inference, explanation, problem solving, and decision making) is considered at all stages of the innovation process.
 - Ensure the resources we provide <u>reflect advances in social studies pedagogy</u>, new research and development models, and societal demands and expectations.
 - <u>Augment our annual conference program with a focus on innovation</u>, offering tailored events, networking opportunities and development space.

HONORING EXCELLENCE

Recognition and celebration of innovation and success as both individuals and as team members should be par for the course of being an NCSS member and is an important ingredient for galvanizing a professional community spirit amongst our association. Our *Fund for the Advancement of Social Studies Education* (FASSE) is central to our ability to support, recognize, and celebrate members' pioneering spirit. We want to use FASSE as a vehicle for building on the NCSS

 - Restate our commitment to FASSE by <u>linking FASSE's strategic priorities with those of NCSS</u> and establishing the Fund as the umbrella under which we distribute all financial support as grants, awards, and scholarships.
 - <u>Revitalize the role of the FASSE Board</u> by including Fund development, growth, and diversification as part of their custodian responsibilities.
 - <u>Recognize the Fund as a foundation for an internal circular knowledge economy</u>, capitalizing on FASSE-related learning and resources to inform the development of our wider membership services and education program.
 - Use the Fund as <u>a means for underpinning and enhancing NCSS' reputation</u>, resources, and reach.
 - <u>Invest in specialist fund management</u>, establishing and building a dedicated team of development and fundraising professionals.
