STUDENT PROGRAMS: 2017-2018

The 9/11 Memorial Museum offers a diverse set of **Student Workshops** for grades 3-12 and **Student Tours** for grades 6-12.

Student Workshops are designed to challenge students to think critically about a wide range of topics related to 9/11 and include an artifact-based tour and an activity in our education center.

Student Tours include an introduction to the Museum in the education center followed by an educator-led tour of select artifacts.

Each program is:

- Inquiry-based
- Led by highly qualified educators
- Aligned with the Common Core Standards

PROGRAM OFFERINGS

EVENTS OF THE DAY

What happened on September 11, 2001?
Explore artifacts to learn about 9/11 and work together to explain the attacks to future generations. For grades 6-12.

REPERCUSSIONS

How has life changed in the post-9/11 world?
Investigate the continuing impact of 9/11 by exploring issues such as the challenge of balancing national security and civil liberties. For grades 9-12.

MEMORIALIZATION & REMEMBRANCE

How do we make meaning of tragic events?
Examine artifacts to understand how individuals and communities memorialized the attacks and create unique pieces of art. For grades 3-8.

UNDERSTANDING 9/11 FOR YOUNG LEARNERS

What happened on September 11, 2001?
Engage in a variety of age-appropriate activities to help understand 9/11 and its aftermath. For grades 3-5.

BUILDING THE WORLD TRADE CENTER

How were the Twin Towers built?
Investigate challenges, develop and test a hypothesis, make observations, and ask questions to learn how the twin towers were constructed. For grades 3-5.

UNDERSTANDING 9/11 TOUR

What happened on September 11, 2001?
Explore what happened on 9/11 by investigating artifacts and consider their ongoing impact on the world. For grades 6-12.

Please Note: Unless otherwise noted, Student Workshops and Tours do not visit the Museum's historical exhibition, *September 11, 2001*. The exhibition may not be appropriate for visitors 10 years old and younger. Adults accompanying younger visitors should exercise discretion before entering.
