Meet the Cast Activity-Answers

Match the Song, Biography, and document written by one of these 4 American Revolutionary Era historical figures.

Alexander Hamilton

Song: "My Shot" (done)

- I was born circa 1755 on the island of Nevis
- As a teenager, I worked as an accounting clerk for a Caribbean shipping company
- I attended Kings College (now Columbia University)
- I served as General Washington's secretary & Aide-de-camp
- I earned the rank of Lieutenant Colonel & led a light infantry battalion at the Battle of Yorktown (1781)

Aaron Burr

Song: "Wait for It" (done)

- I was born in 1756 in Newark, New Jersey
- At the age 13, I enrolled at the College of New Jersey (now Princeton) & graduated at age 16
- I am the grandson of Jonathan Edwards, a famous Great Awakening era preacher
- I fought in the Battle of Quebec (1775) under General Montgomery

- I resigned from the Continental Army in 1779 to continue my studies to become a lawyer

George Washington

Song: "Right Hand Man" (done)

- I was born in 1732 in Virginia
- At 16, I began my studies to become a land surveyor
- At 22, I began my military career in the Virginia militia during the French and Indian War (1754-1762)
- I was appointed General and Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army in 1775
- I lost more battles than I won during my military career

King George III

Song: "You'll Be Back" (done)

- I was born in 1738 in London, England
- I taxed the American colonies to help pay for the wars fought to protect them
- People called me "mad" or insane, but I likely suffered from porphyria and arsenic poisoning
- My granddaughter Victoria stole my title as "longest reigning monarch"
- I refused to acknowledge the independence of the American colonies until the Treaty of Paris (1783)

Gilbert du Motier, Marquis de Lafayette

Song: "Guns and Ships" (done)

- I was born in 1757 in Chavaniac, France
- Military service runs in my family and I became a 2nd Lieutenant in the Musketeers at age 14
- I was commissioned a Major General in the Continental Army, willing to serve without pay
- In 1779, I returned to France to raise money and troops to aid in the American Revolution
- I returned to America in 1780, and fought alongside Washington & Hamilton at the Battle of Yorktown (1781)
